MARRIAGES




***Chartered Bus Transportation from Star of the Sea Church in Long Branch;
All are Welcome; First Come, First Served for Reserved Seats on the Bus***

The annual National March for Life is on Friday, January 23, 2026 in Washington, DC. St. Michael's, Christ the King Parish (Star of the Sea Church and Holy Trinity Church), and Our Lady of Hope of Parish (St. Jerome's Church and St. Mary's Church/Deal) are combining in a three-parish collaboration to provide chartered bus transportation to the March & Rally. All are welcome on this bus; parishioners and non-parishioners alike. The key points of information are:


- Departing at 6:15 a.m. from the Star of the Sea parking lot (111 Chelsea Avenue, Long Branch). Returning to the Star of the Sea parking lot at approximately 10:15 p.m. on Friday night the 23rd. You may park your car for the day in the Star of the Sea parking lot.
- To sign-up for the bus (**reservations in advance are required**) and for additional information, please contact **Kathryn Perez via phone at (732) 581-9735 or via email at prolifekp@aol.com**.
- Fee: \$10.00 per passenger. Cash or check payable to St. Michael's Church may be mailed to the St. Michael's parish office or dropped-off at the St. Michael's parish office (800 Ocean Avenue, Long Branch, NJ 07740) or paid as you board the bus. Please write on the memo line of your check "Bus to 2026 March for Life". **The deadline to reserve a seat on the bus is Tuesday, January 20. Seating on the bus is very limited**, so it is important to sign-up for a seat as soon as possible (first come, first served). Students may travel on the bus at no charge. Children under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a parent.
- The bus will have a restroom on board. There will be a brief 20-minute break at an I-95 rest stop during our morning southbound travel and during our evening northbound travel. Please pray for an end to abortion.

DECREE OF CONCLUSION OF THE HOLY YEAR 2025 IN THE DIOCESE OF TRENTON

On May 9, 2024, Pope Francis formally announced the opening of the Holy Year 2025 with his apostolic letter *“Spes non confudit* (Hope does not disappoint), Romans 5:5.” With its theme “Pilgrims of Hope,” the Holy Year 2025 officially began for the universal Church on December 24, 2024, when Pope Francis customarily opened the bronze Holy Door of St. Peter’s Basilica.

In the Diocese of Trenton, I formally opened the Holy Year 2025 on the weekend of December 28-29, 2024 during Masses at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption in Trenton, New Jersey (December 28, 2024) and at St. Robert Bellarmine Co-Cathedral in Freehold, New Jersey (December 29, 2024).

His Holiness Pope Leo XIV will officially conclude the Holy Year 2025 for the universal Church on January 6, 2026, the Solemnity of the Epiphany, customarily closing the bronze Holy Door before Mass at St. Peter’s Basilica in Rome.


As Bishop, I decree that the Diocese of Trenton will simultaneously conclude its observance of the Holy Year 2025 on that same date and Solemnity, thanking God for all the graces and blessings He has bestowed on the universal and local Church throughout the Holy Year 2025.

Dear Parishioners,

As I was gathering my thoughts to write a much needed thank-you note to the parish, I started to look for a biblical verse to jumpstart my letter, instead of delving right in with the statistics of what we did this year. Nothing says it as simply as St. Matthew, 25:35: **"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in."** This is, in a nutshell, what St. Vincent de Paul is all about: helping people, feeding people, listening, giving advice if needed and hopefully giving them the financial boost that they need to get them back on track.

Food costs have skyrocketed. Rents have jumped to unaffordable rates- missing a few days' work can be catastrophic. Utility prices are escalating. This fiscal year (October 2024 to September 2025) we (the Chapter of St. Vincent de Paul based at St. Michael's) have disbursed \$119,197 in aid: \$84,351 for housing (rents, mortgages) and \$26,126 for utilities and other items. We are so grateful to our parish and to our parishioners for making this possible. We have distributed food to more than 2,000 people. The average value of food bags distributed to each family from our monthly Food Pantry is more than \$120. We also purchased and added nonfood items such as toilet paper, cleaning supplies, personal care items such as shampoo, soap, and diapers when needed (for both adults and child). From time to time, we are able to get pet food. The majority of the food comes from the local foodbank, which we are a member of. We also receive donations from Delicious Orchards, Amazon and Trader Joe's when available. The pantry is open on the third Saturday of the month. The food truck delivery comes the Friday morning before. Help is always needed to put everything together and to bring the bags to the recipients' cars.

The majority of the people served are working families, seniors, and disabled- very few qualify for food stamps. Please keep SVDP as a part of your grocery list if possible- especially for the nonfood items. These cannot be purchased with food stamps. Food cards are always welcome!

Our board meets every Monday evening to go over the calls that come in during the week. We talk about the cases that our volunteers have interviewed. We have been blessed that through the generosity of the parish and parishioners of St. Michael's, that we have funds that can help so many.

Thank you again to all our volunteers and benefactors for, without your support, we could not continue to do what we do. May God bless you and have a happy and healthy New Year!

ANNOUNCEMENT OF EASTER AND THE MOVEABLE FEASTS FOR 2026

Pastor's Note: The Proclamation of the date of Easter and the other moveable feasts of the New Year usually occurs at the Masses in early January on the Feast of the Epiphany, which was last Sunday, January 4. This Proclamation was announced at that day's 12:00 Noon Mass here at St. Michael's. The custom of making this Proclamation on Epiphany Sunday dates from an ancient time when calendars were not readily available. It was necessary to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on its date. The number of Sundays that follow Epiphany, the date of Ash Wednesday, and the number of Sundays that follow Pentecost are all computed in relation to, and as function of, the date of Easter. Although calendars now give the date of Easter and the other feasts in the liturgical year for many years in advance, the Epiphany Proclamation still has value. It is a reminder of the centrality of the Resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith which are celebrated each year.

Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior. And so, let it be known as follows that:

On the eighteenth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the fifth day of April we will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

[In those places where the Ascension is transferred to the Seventh Sunday of Easter:] On the seventeenth day of May (a Sunday now in our Diocese of Trenton) will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the twenty-fourth day of May, the feast of Pentecost.

On the seventh day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the twenty-ninth day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.



The annual National March for Life and Rally for Life in Washington, DC will be on Friday, January 23, 2026. This event has taken place every year since 1974 – the first anniversary of the dreadful *Roe vs. Wade* abortion decision of the United States Supreme Court (issued on January 22, 1973). The March and the Rally “bring together the pro-life movement across the nation, on the Friday closest to this somber anniversary to stand up for the **63 million lives of aborted babies lost since Roe.**” (<https://marchforlife.org/frequently-asked-questions/>). “Since 1974, the March for Life [has rapidly grown] to be the largest pro-life event in the world. This peaceful gathering of hundreds of thousands is a powerful witness to the truth concerning the greatest human rights violation of our time, legalized abortion on demand.” (<https://marchforlife.org/frequently-asked-questions/>).

Parishioners of St. Michael's Church have faithfully attended the March for Life for many years – rising extra early in the morning, bundling-up for the cold January weather, attending early Morning Mass here in Long Branch, boarding our chartered bus for the journey to DC, attending the 12:00 noon Rally for Life at the National Mall, and then at 1:00 p.m. joining in the March for Life and walking up Constitution Avenue to the Supreme Court Building – peacefully, earnestly, and with solemn dignity praying for and advocating for the end of the practice and the legality of abortion; urging the world to be transformed and to view abortion as **not only illegal but UNTHINKABLE.**



If at all possible, PLEASE consider being a member of our parish group and personally participating in this year's March for Life. Yes, it is a sacrifice. And yes, it isn't “easy” in light of the distance and the winter weather and the 16-hour day and so forth. But for the sake of preventing **another** 63 million unborn babies from being aborted (murdered) and for the sake of standing up for our Catholic doctrine of the dignity of the human person and the sanctity of human life, please consider making that sacrifice if at all possible.



If your personal participation in the March and on the bus is not possible, (due to age, health, infirmity, commitments; please use common sense and good judgement), another option that will be greatly appreciated (in addition to your prayers) and that will go a long way to supporting “the cause” and to supporting the parish's pro-life efforts would be **a financial contribution to help St. Michael's and the nearby collaborating parishes pay for the expense of the chartered bus to Washington** (in the range of \$4,000 this year for a 55-seat bus). Checks may be dropped-off at or mailed to the parish business office (made payable to “St. Michael's Church” and with a memo line notation “Bus – March for Life 2026”).

In addition, we will have a second collection at all of our Masses during the weekends of January 10-11 and January 17-18 for this same special March for Life bus purpose. In the event that the proceeds of this special-purpose appeal and collection exceed the bus expense, a donation in the amount of the excess in the name of "St. Michael's Church" will be made to New Jersey Right to Life and to other pro-life organizations for the specific purpose of financially supporting ultra-sound sessions for pregnant women.

Please remember that supporting this year's March for Life is especially vital since:

- It is important and necessary to keep in mind (and to keep the efforts alive and active) that the pro-life cause



and struggles did not come to a conclusion when the *Roe vs. Wade* decision was overruled by the Supreme Court in its 2022 *Dobbs vs. Jackson* decision (issued on the date of the Church's celebration of the **BIRTH** of St. John the Baptist (June 24, 2022): "the baby leaped in his mother's womb when Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting" – Luke 1:41). Awareness and efforts need to be maintained at the Federal/national level as well as at the State and local levels.
