MARRIAGES



Second Collection This Weekend December 13 and 14 For Retirement Fund for Religious





The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

Jesus elevated marriage to a Sacrament at the Wedding Feast at Cana. Catholics have the duty to receive the Sacrament of Matrimony in a Catholic church. The Grace of the Sacrament of Matrimony enhances and supports the permanent and indissoluble bond of marriage and strengthens the love and fidelity, patience and wisdom of the spouses.



Please make contact with the parish office at least one year prior to your intended marriage date to begin the preparation process. This includes attendance at a Pre-Cana Conference and several meetings with one of our parish priests. A specific wedding date cannot be assured by the parish until *after* this marriage preparation has commenced and initial documentation has been received and reviewed. Therefore, all engaged couples are strongly advised to *speak to the parish staff first* when beginning to make wedding plans and *strongly advised not to make commitments with third-parties* (banquet halls, photographers, hotels, airlines, etc.) until *after* the wedding date has been finalized in writing with the parish office.

If you are presently in a civil marriage and desire to receive the Sacrament and enter into a valid Catholic marriage, please contact the parish office at 732-222-8080 to obtain further information about the "convalidation" of your marriage. We also offer direction and assistance on the possibility of receiving an annulment for those who are divorced. Please do not hesitate to call. The annulment process is generally less difficult or cumbersome than imagined.

The Christmas Wafer: The "Oplatki"



The word Bethlehem means "House of Bread". The breaking of bread is a sign of charity, unity, friendship, and hospitality. Religious family traditions and customs bring the truths of Faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas customs is the **Christmas Wafer**. A wafer bearing a simple design commemorative of Christ's birth is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each

member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of the present and absent members of the family, the head family member breaks the wafer and distributes it, a piece to each one at the table. While doing so each member of the family is kissed and is wished a joyful feast. The other family members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age old custom is **unity of the family – the main pillar of society.** The bond of unity is the Christ-like charity that should exist amongst the members of the family. The father of the family is the link in the unbroken chain of One Body, One Bread, One Christ, and One Church. The mother of the family is the symbol of Mary-the Blessed Mother: a symbol of love, maternal care, self-sacrifice, spiritual teacher. The family joins in the eternal procession no matter where they are. For there is a universal longing by men to be always with one another, with God.

All this brings to mind clearly our charity for one another, to seek salvation together. Family customs remind us that we seek and obtain salvation with the help of others at all times.

The Christmas Oplatki wafers will be available at no charge in the parish office on a first come, first served basis due to a very limited number of Oplatki wafers that the parish was able to purchase this year. Please share one (or two! or more!) with your family.

Advent Wreath Prayers at Meal Time

Please (if at all possible) have an *Advent Wreath* on your table at meal time (and throughout the day) during this holy and hopeful Season of Advent. The following prayers are recommended to be prayed *by the <u>family</u>* at the table and over the wreath before each meal (especially dinner) and as the appropriate candles are lighted and burning brightly to represent *Jesus*, the <u>LIGHT</u> of the *World*.

The head of the home or an appointed person will lead the other members of the family in the prayer.



Prayer for First Week of Advent (Hope) – November 30 thru December 6

(This prayer should be repeated each day during the first week. After the prayer, the family's <u>youngest member lights the first purple candle.</u>)

Leader: O Lord, stir up Thy might, we beg Thee, and come, that by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by Thy deliverance. Through Christ our Lord. All: Amen.

Prayer for Second Week of Advent (Love) – December 7 thru December 13

(This prayer should be repeated each day during the second week. After the prayer, the family's <u>oldest member lights both the first and second purple candles.</u>)

Leader: O Lord, stir up our hearts that we may prepare for Thy only begotten Son, that through His coming we may be made worthy to serve Thee with pure minds. Through Christ our Lord. All: Amen.

Prayer for Third Week of Advent (Joy) – December 14 thru December 20



The Third Sunday in Advent is also known as the The Joyful Sunday and it is represented by the rose/pink candle.

(This prayer should be repeated each day during the third week. After the prayer, the mother of the family will light the first and second purple candles and the rose candle.)

Leader: O Lord, we beg Thee, incline Thy ear to our prayers and enlighten the darkness of our minds by the grace of Thy visitation. Through Christ our Lord. All: Amen.

Prayer for Fourth Week of Advent (Peace) - December 21 thru December 24

(This prayer should be repeated each day during the fourth week. After the prayer, the <u>head of the family will light</u> <u>all four candles.</u>)

Leader: O Lord, stir up Thy power, we pray Thee, and come; and with great might help us, that with the help of Thy Grace, Thy merciful forgiveness may hasten what our sins impede. Through Christ our Lord. All: Amen.



An Advent Reflection: Thy Kingdom Come



It's called the "Magic of Christmas." All those good feelings and the cheery hustle and bustle of the season. The humming of carols, trees with twinkling lights, green wreaths adorned in red, gold or silver bows, and so many other delights that help make this a merry season. And for some reason our greetings are especially heartfelt, and we have a particular desire to do something good and to be generous to others. Is it really magic? No, my friend, you may not realize it, but <u>God</u> is calling you.

As human beings with bodies, we take in things through our senses. The "Christmas Magic" is God using our touch, sight, hearing, taste and smell to inform our spiritual sense of

something incredibly wonderful - His love for us. Christmas is God's supreme act of speaking to us through the material world in the Incarnation of His Son, Jesus. God made flesh.

It is a holy tradition to celebrate the birth of Jesus, but that is not what we are preparing for. After all, that happened over two thousand years ago. We need to continually prepare for the glorious <u>Second</u> Coming of Jesus, when He will come to judge us, whether we are living or we're dead. Until then He is with us unseen yet helping us to be ready for Him. So, let us ask ourselves, "Am I ready to meet Jesus, face to face?"

To answer that question we need to know why the Father sent Jesus to us, and how we are expected to respond. I will offer you my limited reflection, but it shan't end there lest we get ensnared by the "magic" instead of hearing God's voice. It is for you to take St.

Anslem's advice this Advent and escape from your everyday business for a short while, hide for a moment from your restless thoughts. Break off from your cares and troubles and be less concerned about your tasks and labors. Make a little time for God and rest a while in Him.

Here are some thoughts for your meditation on why Jesus was incarnated. His "to do" list would include:

- To do the will of His Father.
- To do "The Good News" of how immeasurably God loves us.
- To do revelation of our identity and infinite value as brother or sister to the Son of God, Jesus Christ through His incarnation, becoming man.
- To do light into a dark world, bearing witness to the Truth.
- To do the defeat of death and the defeat of the works of Satan.
- To do the calling of sinners to repentance.
- To do the giving of His life as a ransom to save sinners.
- To do restoring humanity to holiness, making us partakers of Divine Nature.
- To do the opening of the Gates of Heaven so that we can enjoy eternal happiness in the Trinity of God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- To do the fulfilling of the Law of the Prophets.
- To do an everlasting covenant with His followers, the Church.
- To do the establishment of the seven sacraments of salvation.
- To do the ushering in of the era of the Holy Spirit.
- To do the example of how we are to live our lives.

More could be added to this list, but the all-encompassing answer is this: Our Heavenly Father sent Jesus to establish the kingdom of God.

What is the kingdom of God, you ask? It is the presence of Jesus Christ in the hearts of believers, you and me, His Body the Church, which brings into the world God's immeasurable, unconditional, irretrievable and sacrificial



love. His kingdom brings forth righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit in the daily lives of the faithful. Not until the end of history will this kingdom be fully realized.

So then, what is expected of each one of us? How do we prepare for our in-person meeting with Jesus? By building up the kingdom of God with the time we are given. That will require faith, discipline, sacrifice and commitment to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. The Holy Spirit will show the way.

First, we must own up to and repent of and confess our sins according to God's revealed Truth – known through the Bible and in the Catholic Church - and not be excused by our

own opinions. With that weight lifted in sacramental confession, in our obedience to Christ we show our love for Him and in our actions we live a life of charity, kindness, justice, forgiveness and integrity. But this is not a solo act. It is imperative that we share the Gospel of Good News with others. (Perhaps where most of us could do a better job.)

Instead of "Magic of Christmas, the "Reality of Christmas" comes from God's initiative and our response to and our cooperation with His initiative. So that we will live a purposeful life pleasing to God, have a genuine relationship and ultimate union with Jesus, eternal life, and everlasting peace in Heaven - where the lights never dim, the green never fades, the caroling never wearies, and the merriment that comes from loving goes on and on.

Please keep in mind that the parish priests and our lay Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist are available and eager to bring Communion to parish-




